The structure of Edmonds is a Mayor and City Council. The City Council is charged with implementing policy that can affect the future of our citizenry in regards to land-use, financial clarity, zoning, home occupations and many other issues and items. Since I was appointed to city council in January 2010, I have continued to fulfill my campaign message which was 1) improve financial clarity and transparency; 2) Environmental oversight, education and implementation, and 3) economic development that respects community empowerment. My record reflects a strong voice and consistent change in all these areas. In regards to financial clarity and oversight, policies and procedures were implemented to allow all citizens transparent financial, budgets and budget amendments. In regards to the environment, I have been on the WRIA 8 (Water Resource Area 8) Salmon Recovery Council and have sat on the Salmon Recovery Grant Funding Committee. My greatest accomplishment has been my continued focus on the Edmonds Marsh Estuary Restoration. In 2011, as a new member of the WRIA8 Salmon Recovery Council, I was instrumental in getting the "Daylighting of Willow Creek" for Edmonds Marsh restoration onto their priority list. I am also a member of the Puget Sound Partnership Salmon Recovery Council. Here are the consistent programs that I have supported: 1) Edmonds Marsh Estuary Restoration; 2) Complete Streets Programs and Pedestrian Safety; 3) Stormwater upgrades and "Puget Sound Starts Here" educational campaign. 4) Assisted in the creation of the Citizens Tree Board which I was the Council liaison for five years and ended tenure in 2020; 5) Mayors' Climate Protection Committee which I was the Council liaison for five years and ended my tenure in 2020. In regards to community empowerment and economic development my record reflects issues such as supporting homelessness and public safety regarding issues surrounding homelessness, tenacious regarding zoning changes and the need for updated environmental assessments because of housing stock and density changing in previously zoned areas, retaining the downtown charm and growing the other sub-areas of our City. Mostly, my continued knowledge of municipal finance has helped save our taxpayers millions of dollars and I do listen so as we can retain our healthy community lifestyle.
